

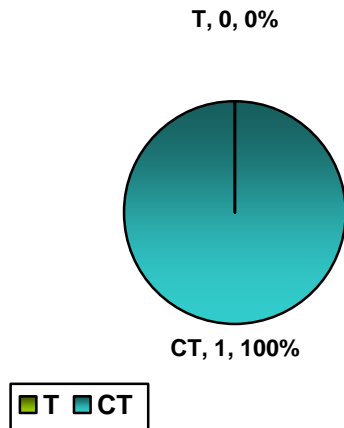
**MONTHLY COUNTRY REPORT
INDONESIA
AUGUST 2008**

This month the security situation in Indonesia remained relatively calm. There was no terrorist attack in Indonesia for the month of August 2008 and one counter terrorism operation launched by the Indonesian authorities. In counter terrorism, importance and good practice of inter-state cooperation in countering terrorism was demonstrated.

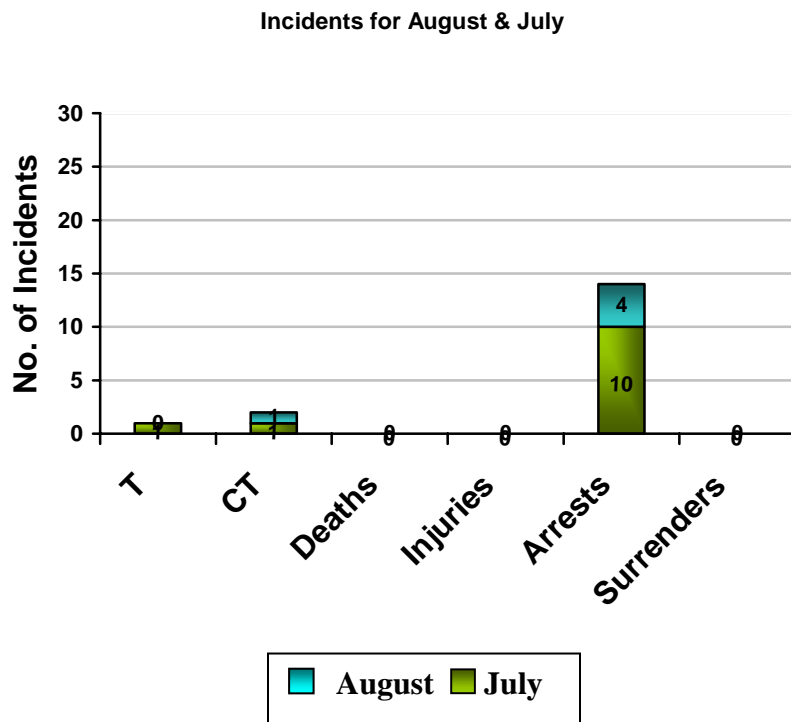

Number of Incidents



- In counter terrorism, the four Indonesian men detained at the Kemunting Taiping prison in Perak, Malaysia were deported to Indonesia on 15 August 2008 for their alleged involvement with Jemaah Islamiyah (JI). They are currently under the detention of the Detachment 88, an Indonesian anti-terror special unit. The four men, Abdullah Minyak bin Silam, Shahrial bin Sirin, Zainudin bin Suharno, and Jaki bin Hamid, were among 13 other Indonesian detained under Malaysia's internal security act at the Kemunting Taiping prison. Zainudin and Jaki were arrested in Malaysia's Sandakan waters carrying M16 rifles. The former once joined the Ambon Mujahidin Group and the Philippine's Moro Islamic Liberation Front (MILF) separatist group.

Comparative Analysis



- The number of terrorism incidents has decrease from 1 in July to null in August.
- The number of casualties has remained the same between July and August. This is primarily because there have not been any major attacks in Indonesia.
- The number of arrests of suspected terrorists has proven the affectivity of security measures in Indonesia.
