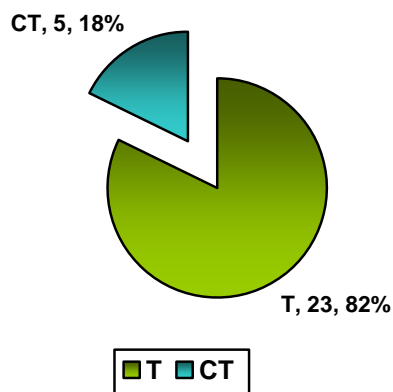

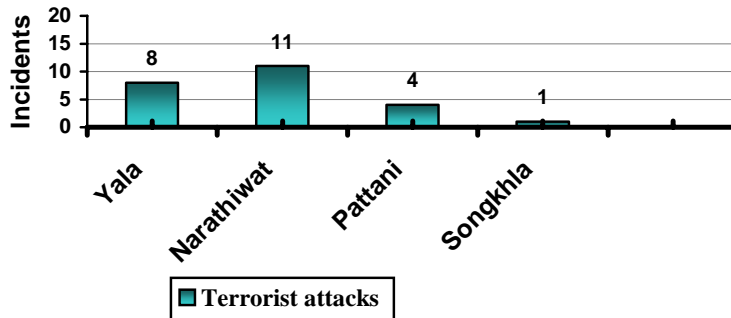

Number of Incidents



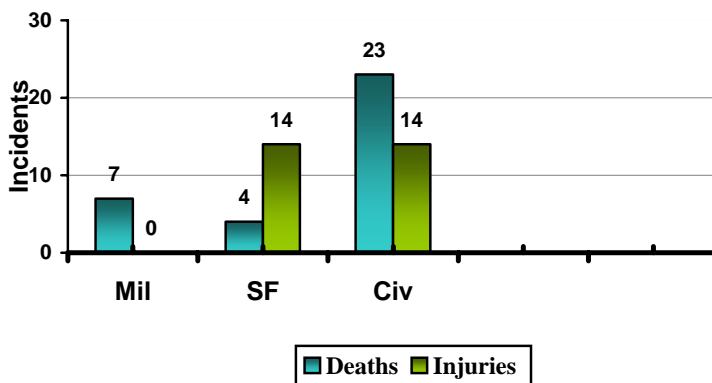
- A total of 23 terrorist attacks were carried out this month. As with previous months, no groups claimed responsibility for any of the attacks.
- While the insurgents have chiefly targeted security forces, the majority of the casualties have been civilians.
- The figures also show that roadside bombs and targeted shootings were favoured by the insurgents in June 2008.

Terrorist Incidents by area distribution- June 2008



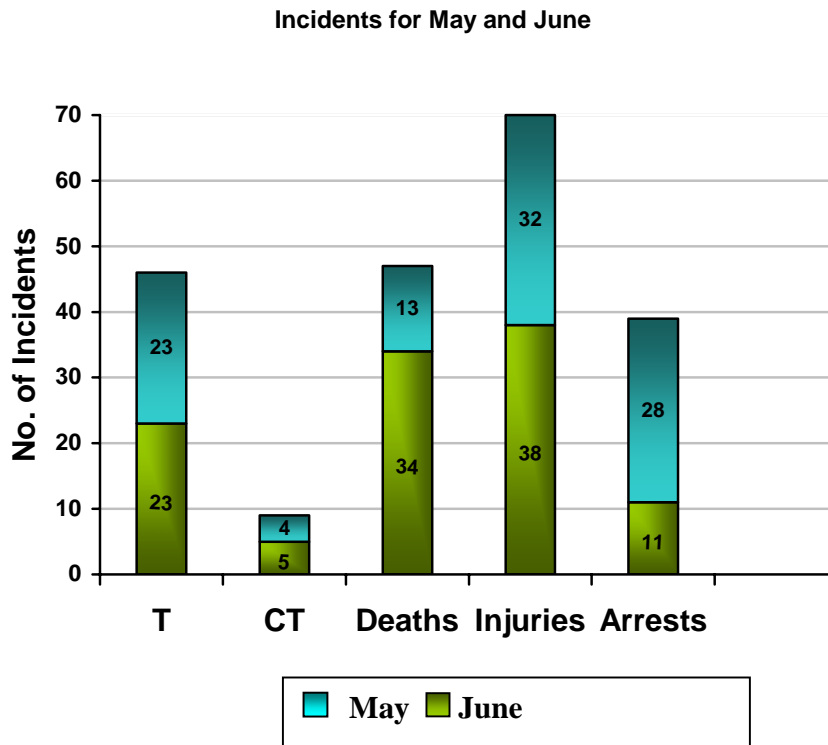
- The graph shows the regional division of terrorism incidents in Southern Thailand. As with May 2008 hotspot in June 2008 was Narathiwat, where nearly than half of the month’s reported terrorist incidents occurred.
- In May 2008 there were no reported incidents in Satun or Songkhla. However, there was one reported incident in Songkhla in June 2008.

Terrorist Incidents and Counter Terrorism Operations - Breakdown of Casualties- May 2008



- The above graph tabulates the number of casualties (killed or injured) of the law enforcement agencies, militants and civilians. The figures show the majority of the people killed or injured have been members of the public.

Comparative Analysis



- There were exactly the same number of terrorist incidents in May and June 2008.
- The number of injuries remained fairly similar in May and June 2008. However, the number of deaths in June (34) was substantially higher than it was in May (13).
- In June 2008, there were fewer than half the number of arrests made in May 2008.
- There were no reported insurgent surrenders in May or June.
